Coursed offered virtually at Springfield Technical Community College (STCC) in partnership with Massachusetts Water Works Association (MWWA) January 21,2025 – April 13, 2025

Course prepares students to sit for the Treatment 2 (T2) water treatment state licensing exam (required to work as a licensed water operator).

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION: The scholarship covers the \$900 tuition and cost of books (approximately \$200). The Commission will select up three recipients per session/semester.

APPLICANT CRITERIA:

- Preference given to Hampden County residents.
- Matriculated Massachusetts community college students are not eligible as the course is already offered to them free of charge. Non-matriculated community college students are eligible.
