- Course offered virtually at Springfield Technical Community College (STCC) in partnership with Massachusetts Water Works Association (MWWA)
- January 20, 2026 – April 12, 2026 (self-paced)
- Intended for students with some knowledge of the drinking water process and interest in further pursuing a career as a licensed water operator. Course prepares students to sit for the Treatment 2 (T2) water treatment state licensing exam (required to work as a licensed water operator).
