Springfield Water and Sewer Commission Hosts "Truck or Treatment" for Community Children

Event Combines Water Education and Seasonal Fun

The Springfield Water and Sewer Commission (Commission) will host a "Truck or Treatment" event at the Commission's Operations Center at 71 Colton Street **tomorrow on Wednesday, November 5** from 3-5 PM. (This event was rescheduled from October 30 due to weather.)

Children and their families are invited to interact with large seasonally decorated trucks from the Commission's specialized water fleet and learn about the source of their water and other related topics. Interactive educational displays, including a "toilet toss" game that educates children and adults alike about what can and can't be flushed down the toilet, will be featured along with many opportunities to collect various treats.

"We are excited for this opportunity to interact with our future customers in a fun way that educates them about the value of their water and sewer system, and what they can do to protect it," said Educational Outreach Manager Katie Shea.

The event will be held on the corner of Union Street and Eastern Avenue, across from the Commission's Field Operations Center.
